
Mr. Heath showed great interest in the Computer. Here he chals to Mr. J. Barrington, watched by Mr. Morton and Mr. Sumner.

At a Press Conference afterwards, Mr. Heath said that the factory was well laid out and equipped with some of the most modern plant in the country. He added that he had met some very interesting people


